AEN Provision

Literacy/Numeracy Groups

These small groups run from AEN department and are delivered by a member of the Support team or an ESA. Students identified for this group are withdrawn from timetabled lessons to develop basic skills; mostly improving numeracy and literacy.

Social Skills Groups

Another small group session, this is for students identified as struggling with social interaction. The young people are withdrawn from timetabled lessons to work on improving skills needed for social interaction, building friendships, citizenship etc.

Examination Access Arrangements

Staff are encouraged to forward any concern regarding individual students who may require additional support, especially if it will impair their attainment outcomes in examination. The AENCO updates staff with strategies following any concern and oversees all testing arrangements which may be required to determine whether a student needs further support in examinations. The arrangements are placed on the Student Passports.

Anger Management

This is a small group or 1:1 sessions for students identified as struggling with emotional difficulties. Students are withdrawn from timetabled lessons to work on recognising their behaviour/reactions and working on strategies to avoid future situations in classroom environments.

Life Skills Groups

These are mainly 1:1 sessions which focus on budgeting, looking after yourself, health and safety, and cooking. Students are withdrawn from timetabled lessons to develop skills which will prepare them for an independent future.



Transition Groups

We invite a selected number of Year 6 students to attend an hour per week over a 5 week period to become familiar with a secondary school environment to ease their anxieties about transition.
